# Power Outage Food Checklist

Review these points before relying on food during an outage.

- Use safe shelf-stable foods first when appropriate.
- Do not rely on questionable refrigerated food.
- Keep manual can opener available.
- Track what was used.
- Follow official local food safety guidance.
- Keep refrigerator/freezer doors closed as much as possible.
- Use no-cook meals if cooking is not safe.
- Use clean utensils and safe water.
- Restock after the event.
- Avoid unsafe indoor cooking methods.



# Quick Reference Checklist

A fast overview for monthly pantry organization.

- Check inventory before shopping.
- Plan low-cook meals.
- Label pantry zones.
- Track restock items.
- Update family needs.
- Plan no-cook meals.
- Review water needs.
- Move use-first foods forward.
- Review shelf-life notes.
- Set monthly pantry review date.
